ACCJ Receives the Prestigious "Peace Through Commerce" Medal for 2012

May 16, 2013 – The American Chamber of Commerce in Japan (ACCJ) today was presented with the "Peace Through Commerce" Medal for 2012. Ambassador of the United States to Japan John V. Roos and U.S. Under Secretary of Commerce for International Trade Francisco J. Sánchez presented the medal to the ACCJ, and the presentation was followed by a keynote speech by Under Secretary Sánchez attended by both members of the ACCJ and the press.

The Peace Through Commerce Medal, originally commissioned in 1790 by Thomas Jefferson during his tenure as the United States' first Secretary of State, has been awarded to fewer than 20 individuals and organizations in its 223-year history. It is the highest honor awarded by the U.S. Department of Commerce, recognizing those whose actions contribute to the promotion of peace and commerce through international trade and by strengthening relationships between countries.

ACCJ Chairman Michael J. Alfant, who was ACCJ President in 2012 - the time frame for which the Medal was awarded - said, "I was extremely honored to receive this award on behalf of the ACCJ. This recognition of the great work that ACCJ members do every day to strengthen ties between the U.S. and Japan and to promote 'peace through commerce' is a true milestone for the Chamber, and our members can be proud."

ACCJ President Laurence W. Bates added, "This medal is really a testament to the hard work of thousands of ACCJ members to improve commercial ties between our two countries. At the ACCJ, we wouldn't be able to do so much that we do were it not for the great support of our counterparts in the U.S. Department of Commerce and throughout the U.S. Government, so to receive this medal from such great friends makes the award that much more special to us."
