Richard B. Dasher Director, US-Asia Technology



At Stanford University, Richard Dasher, PhD, is Director of the US-Asia Technology Management Center (since 1994), Executive Director of the Center for Integrated Systems (since 1998), and Consulting Professor in the Department of Electrical Engineering (technology management) and the Department of Asian Languages (Japanese business). Dr. Dasher was the first non - Japanese person ever asked to join the senior governance of a Japanese national university, serving on the Board of Directors and subsequently on the Management Council of Tohoku University from April 2004 - 2010, where he continues as Senior Advisor to the president.

Dr. Dasher is a member of the Program Committee of Japan's World Premier International Research Center initiative and co-chair of the Review Panel of the Canada Excellence Research Chairs program. He serves on the International Advisory Council of the Thailand Institute of Scientific and Technological Research. From 2001-2003, he was a member of the International Advisory Committee to the Japanese Minister of State for Science and Technology Policy in regard to the creation of the Okinawa Institute of Science and Technology.

Dr. Dasher is advisor to the Draper Nexus venture capital firm in Silicon Valley, the K-Startup business accelerator in Seoul, and start-up companies in the U.S., Japan, S. Korea, and China. He is fluent in Japanese and directed the U.S. State Department's Foreign Service Institute training centers in Japan and Korea and was a salaried board director of two Japanese companies in Tokyo, at which he expanded the companies' international business.
