



Dean Drako is founder and CEO of Eagle Eye Networks. Drako founded Eagle Eye Networks in 2012 and has grown it to be the largest global provider of cloud video surveillance solutions with over 11 data centers and customers in 47 countries. Eagle Eye is acknowledged as being #1 in Cloud Video Surveillance worldwide. Drako is Chairman of Brivo, Inc, the largest provider of cloud based access control systems for buildings.

Dean Drako was founder, President and CEO of Barracuda Networks, creating the world's first email security appliance in 2003. Drako grew the company to be a broad line networking company with more than 140 products spanning security, networking, backup, and data protection, with ~1000 employees and 150,000 customers. In 2007, he was named "Technology Entrepreneur of the Year" for Northern California" by Ernst & Young. Drako resigned from Barracuda Networks in 2012 to found Eagle Eye Networks.

In 1995, Drako was founder, President and CEO of Design Acceleration Inc., which developed design verification products used by nearly every semiconductor company in the world; Drako sold the Company to Cadence Design Systems (Ticker:CDNS) in 1999. In 1999, he founded Boldfish, an enterprise messaging solutions provider, which was acquired by Siebel Systems in 2003. In addition to founding Barracuda Networks in 2003, Drako also founded IC Manage, a company that manages semiconductor R&D teams' data, which he continues to run as President and CEO.

Drako earned an MSEE degree from the University of California Berkeley, and a BSEE degree from the University of Michigan. Drako holds over 30 patents, does angel investing, and acts as an advisor to numerous companies.
